Seniors Nick Orfanella and Bryon Laird of the LVC track and field team wrapped up their outstanding collegiate careers Friday afternoon at the NCAA Division III Outdoor Championships, hosted by Wisconsin-Oshkosh. Orfanella finished seventh in the discus, and in the process captured all-America honors for the first time in his career.

For the second year in a row, 2007 graduates Zach Kaufman and Erik Vargo of the LVC men's tennis team have been named to the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District II College Division Men's At-Large First Team. Both Kaufman and Vargo will advance to the national ballot for consideration on the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America College Division Men's At-Large Team, which will be announced on Tuesday, June 12.
