The LVC Football Team and Servants of Christ were awarded the 2006 President's Award for exemplifying the achievements, character, and leadership shown by the early leaders of the College. Members of these two organizations completed a combined total

of some 3,000 hours of community service. Twelve different student organizations and athletic teams at LVC applied for the President's Award. Combined, these groups completed 9,164 hours of service during the 2005 calendar year. Monica Johnson of the LVC women's basketball team was named to the All-Commonwealth Conference First Team. This past season, she set single-season school records for scoring (489 points) and rebounding (282 rebounds).

Jimmy Curran of the men's basketball team was named to the All-Commonwealth Conference First Team. Also, Kyle Enoch was named as the Commonwealth Conference Rookie of the Year.

The men's and women's swimming teams combined to set 10 school records at the Middle Atlantic Conference championships Feb. 10–12. Freshman Kevin Carney earned a bronze medal in the 1,650-yard freestyle, becoming the first LVC swimmer to medal at MAC's since Seth Klinefelter won the gold in the 100-yard backstroke in 1997.

The last trivia question was ... One hundred years ago, legend tells that LVC President Abram Paul Funkhouser saved LVC from what??

Answer: In 1906, the College's debt soared to \$86,089. Creditors no longer looked at Lebanon Valley College in a favorable light. Lawsuits were issued against the College because of unpaid debts. President Abram Paul Funkhouser, by a miracle (so legend has it), saved LVC from a dire situation. Legend tells of the sheriff being on campus ready to collect or shut down the College. At the last second, Funkhouser stormed onto campus, money in hand, and managed to, literally, buy more time and begin the restoration of Lebanon Valley College's good name. The loan reportedly came from the Zimmermans of Chambersburg, the same town in Pennsylvania that once tried to buy LVC.
